






Mental Health Awareness Week

Women @ HTA

For International Women's Day (IWD) on 8th March 2025, we celebrated the amazing contributions of women at HTA and around the world. In the UK built environment industry, women have made significant stwrides over the years, but challenges remain.

This year, HTA marked IWD with a focus on action, reflection, and progress. The 2025 theme, #AccelerateAction, encouraged us to take meaningful steps toward gender equality – a commitment we continue to champion.

In March, we hosted a lunchtime event titled 'Sharing Experience,' where colleagues took part in informal conversations on gender equality, guided by discussion prompt cards. We also shared stories of pioneering women in the built environment, including Dame Zaha Hadid, Jocelyn Frere Adburgham, Sylvia Law, and Gertrude Jekyll, and held group photos across our studios.

Founded by three Edinburgh-based colleagues, Women@HTA has played a key role in shaping a more inclusive workplace. Their early research identified barriers including confidence gaps, lack of role models, and challenges around maternity. Their work has led to HTA providing flexible working policy improvements, developing training programmes for women in architecture, and having more visible female role models.

People's Pavilion Design Workshop

University of West London Studio Visit

On November 13th, our Bristol office hosted 18 students and four graduates from UWE's International Architecture Foundation course for a presentation about our projects, career transitions, and working in practice.

It was an absolute pleasure to have the opportunity to introduce our International Foundation students to their first UK practice - Kate Byrne, Course Lead





On Monday, 16th June 2025, we delivered an 'Architecture Day' at Trinity High School in Manchester. This was a full-day event aimed at introducing students to careers in the built environment.

The day began with a short introduction and icebreaker. Students then listened to a series of rapid-fire career presentations by industry professionals, followed by a panel discussion where they asked questions about the speakers' roles and career journeys. This section of the day concluded with a masterplanning activity, where students worked in small groups to redesign Manchester using building cut-outs.

Later, students were taken on a guided site tour of Circle Square, led by landscape architects from Planit. The tour provided insight into real-world urban design and green infrastructure. Students then returned to the school to prepare for the afternoon session.

Once back in the classroom, students were split into groups of five to participate in a hands-on design competition. After sketching their ideas, they built physical models of their proposed buildings.

The models were then presented to the wider group and reviewed by the professionals. Later prizes were given out for the 'Best Use of Colour,' 'Best Use of Materials,' and 'Most Sustainable Design,' along with an HTA Design goodie bag.







Hackney 100

In September 2024, as part of our commitment to social value, we supported the Hackney100+ Skills programme. This initiative is aimed at adults aged 25+ who are eager to work but face barriers due to a lack of skills or experience. The 12-week programme offers employability training, paid work experience at the London Living Wage, and the opportunity to gain Level 2 qualifications, while also improving soft skills, English, and maths.

We provided Hackney resident, Tannika Foote, with a Studio Assistant placement for two days a week for 12 weeks. From the outset, Tannika's enthusiasm, commitment, and eagerness to learn made a strong impression. Her contributions quickly proved invaluable to the team. After her initial placement, we were delighted to offer her a full-time role.

We were honoured to be named Best Employer of the Hackney 100 programme in recognition of our commitment to supporting emerging talent. Programmes like Hackney 100 play a vital role in opening doors to employment, and we are proud to be part of this initiative.

On Thursday, February 20th, we welcomed 14 students from the Manchester School of Architecture to our office in Hackney Wick.

Their visit began with a guided tour led by our Studio Manager, Erica Hera White, followed by lunch in our LuncHTAbles area.

After lunch, Senior Architect Harry
Hamberger and Part I Architectural Assistant
Evan Hall gave a presentation on HTA's recent
projects at Milton Heights and Haddenham,
developed in collaboration with Greencore
Homes. Greencore specialises in high-quality,
factory-built, climate-positive homes using
closed timber-frame panels insulated with
natural materials.

During the presentation, Harry and Evan discussed panel systems, housing, and sustainable drainage design. Later in the day, Associate Partner and Senior Architect Kwame Ohene-Adu introduced our modular projects, including One Lansdowne Road, Savoy Circus, and Ten Degrees. He spoke about modular design, the installation process, and how the modules are delivered to the site. Overall, it was a great experience for everyone involved.






City Academy School Workshop

Following the success of our ongoing partnership with Mossbourne Academy, the Assistant Principal at City Academy, Hackney, approached us to explore a similar collaboration. Their goal was to deliver an engaging outreach programme that introduces students to the built environment and inspires interest in architecture as a career path.

For City Academy, we developed a tailored programme for their students, starting with an Introduction to Architecture Workshop. This workshop provided a broad overview of the built environment sector through interactive activities, a presentation, and direct engagement with HTA professionals.

We recognise the value gained by young people who are provided with opportunities to undertake good-quality, practical work experience whilst still in education. This can help them to develop a good understanding of the 'world of work' and assist them in making important decisions about their future career.
