#### Mossbourne Community Academy

On November 8th, 2023, Outreach Lead Shawn On 21st June, 2024, we hosted students Adams, and interior designer Mattia Treccani teamed up with architectural assistants Sven Gillet and Rebecca Jak from Lynch Architects and Malcolm Ebose from Wright and Wright Architects to deliver an exciting design workshop at Mossbourne Community Academy in Hackney. During the session, students did a survey of the railway arch located on their school's grounds using lasers and measuring tapes then later worked with the designers to sketch out options for the railway arch.


## Work **Experience**

## **Drummond Community High School Visit**

On Friday 10th May, 2024, Partner, Sandy Morrison took Drummond Community High School students on a tour of our Edinburgh office. Drummond Community High School is a comprehensive secondary school in Edinburgh city centre.

During their tour, Sandy spoke to the students about careers as a designer and the what types of work architects do. Students also got to view our projects, saw physical models, and learned about the software we use in the office.

#### **Make Space For Girls**

In May 2024, we teamed up with Make Space for Girls to run a workshop for the Jamal Edwards Delve Youth Group. The session focused on a mapping exercise to identify young people's concerns and needs in the local area. During the workshop, the young people discussed why they feel safe or unsafe in certain areas and what could be done to improve these places.

In June 2024 we did another workshop with Make Space for Girl's where we worked with young people to design public spaces. Using images the young people made collages of how they wanted spaces in their local area to look. All the young women and most of the young men proposed chill out spaces over designated play areas or activity zones.

'Make Space for Girls' campaigns for facilities and public spaces for teenage girls. The organisation uses research and campaigning to ensure that the voices of young women are heard in the planning process. MSfG is currently working on a range of projects that improve parks and other outdoor spaces in order to support opportunities for teenage girls and improve their mental and physical well-being.





## **World AIDs Day**

For World AIDS Day we had a bake sale which raised a total of £166. World AIDS Day is an international day which takes place on 1st December. The day seeks to raise awareness of AIDS which is caused by the spread of the HIV infection. On this day, people around the world come together to remember those who have lost their lives and are affected by the disease.



## South Asian Heritage Month

This South Asian Heritage Month, we celebrated South Asian culture with delicious food and interactive workshops. The London and Manchester studios held a Batik workshop where participants learned about the origins of Batik and created prints on tea towels.

We shared South Asian films, books, musicians, and cultural events through a special email newsletter, offering everyone the opportunity to explore and appreciate the vibrant creativity coming from this region.

As ever, food was at the core of our celebrations, with Sue Gerald and Craig Jones Rowley cooking South Asian dishes for lunch in London and Edinburgh. Manchester and Bristol got involved too, sourcing lunch from a South Asian-owned business.

The purpose of South Asian Heritage Month (SAHM) is to commemorate, mark, and celebrate the diverse cultures, histories, and contributions of South Asian communities, particularly in the UK. SAHM aims to foster understanding and appreciation of the rich heritage that connects the UK with South Asia, which includes countries like India, Pakistan, and Bangladesh





Working in collaboration with Wandsworth Council, we launched an exciting interior design competition for young people to design a show flat in Mitchell House as part of Winstanley and York Road Regeneration. As part of the council's commitment to genuine engagement with residents, proposals were made to provide a 'show home' which would allow future residents to view a typical new flat.

The competition was structured as a live project, enabling participants to gain real-world experience designing and pitching their interior design proposals for the flat. HTA Interiors team worked closely with the participants for over a year, helping them respond to a set brief and budget and produce a design based on their ideas.

The competition winner, Ricky Le, was able to see his design be brought to life in the Mitchell House show flat. Ricky impressed the judges with his creativity and outstanding design concept. The 126 families who will be moving in to Block 5 will meet with the Council in Ricky's show flat to see the potential of their new homes.

#### Winstanley Engagement Day

The Winstanley project team and client team from Wandsworth Council organised a half-term family day on May 30th at the new temporary event space in front of Pennethorne House, which will eventually be developed into a new block for other estate residents as part of the York Gardens Park project.

The event featured a range of activities including basketball, table tennis, crazy golf, and football, providing children aged 4-14 and their parents with an afternoon full of fun and friendly competition.

We led the arts and crafts on the day and invited participants to use the Lavender Road hoarding as an "ideas board" to share what they'd like to see on the estate. This quickly turned into a heartwarming opportunity for young people to write meaningful messages to their friends and families.





## The People's Pavilion Build Volunteering

In July 2023, members of staff volunteered to build the 2023 People's Pavilion which was constructed in Lea Bridge Library's garden. The structure was built solely by Beyond The Box, project collaborators, and volunteers, there were no contractors involved, which is quite an impressive feat.

Titled 'Roots of Heritage' the pavilion was designed by three aspiring architects from the East London Borough of Tower Hamlets. One of the main features of the pavilion design was to allow for anonymous messages to activate the pavilion, with visitors invited to write things down that they wished to share but may have never said aloud.

#### **BADU**

In July, 2024, HTA's BLACC group teamed up with community development organisation BADU to deliver an interactive model-making workshop for a group of young people. This session was led by Architectural Apprentice Sia Musa, Part II Architectural Assistant Aaliyah Lawal, Outreach Lead Shawn Adams, and Architect Tanatswa Borerwe.

After a brief introduction and icebreaker, the young people learned about a variety of built environment career paths and what steps they might take to pursue them, including architecture, landscape architecture, planning, and engineering.

Next, we took the students on a tour of Hackney Wick, showing them the local area. Once back in the studio, they worked in groups to plan and design a model of a building that they felt would benefit Hackney Wick.

The students created a variety of colourful building models which they presented back to their peers in the style of a group crit.
